CHDS EXECUTIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

WHO WE ARE

The Center for Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS) Executive Education Program (EEP) provides a wide range of tailored homeland security educational opportunities designed to help strengthen U.S. capability to prevent, deter, prepare for, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks, natural disasters, and public health and safety threats. Program deliveries build the intergovernmental, interagency, and civil-military cooperation that homeland security requires.

Since 2003, CHDS has conducted hundreds of Executive Education Seminars with senior elected officials and homeland security leaders around the country including governors and mayors/county executives of major metropolitan areas.

In 2018, the EEP built on the Center's great history of delivering Executive Education Seminars to develop a wide portfolio of educational opportunities including workshops, symposia and short courses for homeland security executives and practitioners around the country. The EEP team works with requesting government agencies and professional associations to customize educational content to meet participant needs and organizational objectives.

All executive education offerings focus on the strategic planning, policy development, and organizational design challenges that homeland security can pose for senior leaders. EEP events may cover a broad range of homeland security issues important to leaders and decision-makers or be designed to explore a single challenge in depth.

TRANSITION TO VIRTUAL

In response to COVID-19, the Executive Education Program team shifted from on-site events to virtual deliveries using technology tools to deliver a wide variety of programs including interactive private seminars and workshops for senior leaders and informational webinars for larger audiences.

The EEP is working with experts from around the globe to provide real-time educational opportunities, identify emergent practices, and develop resources to support homeland security executives, practitioners, and educators during the pandemic.






NATIONAL COVID-19 ISSUES SURVEY

The Center for Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS) Executive Education Program distributed a survey to CHDS students, alumni, and the national homeland security practitioner and academic communities to determine topics of interest in supporting the evolving needs of executives, practitioners, and educators during the COVID-19 pandemic. The COVID-19 Issues Survey Report summarized survey data from 804 total respondents. This survey was open from April 30 - June 1, 2020.



The Survey Report was also shared with academic partners and national homeland security, emergency management, public health and public safety organizations to inform their educational planning.





- Event information includes the date and the city/state where the event was held.



